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Jubilant July

July is a time when hedgerows are verdant with the hum of insects, when the days are hotter and when nights warmer – summer is in full swing. Sheldon Field is at its best with ancient meadows providing a place for butterflies and day moths as well as other insects. The local fields are all showing evidence of growing crops. It is the peak of summer. Keep a lookout for red kites as they have increasingly been seen in our area. They are big birds of prey with a noticeable forked tail and curved wings who love to ride on the wind. They are able fliers frequently chased by crows who seem to hate them but they seemingly largely ignore such interference. Buzzards, a more common bird of prey are also regularly seen around Cropwell Butler and also get mobbed by crows. They are similarly large birds but have rounded and broader wings.

One bird to look out for on balmy evenings in July is the iconic barn owl which is usually in evidence around our fields hunting for mice, shrews and voles. They are seen to be ghost-like as they are white and quarter the ground silently.

Hot and sticky weather in July sees one of the great wildlife spectacles as millions of ants pour from their nests and take to the sky on temporary wings which have developed in the nest. These are sexually mature adults mostly males but with a few virgin queens amongst them and they appear everywhere, both outside and indoors. They form a good source of food for swallows and swifts who can be seen in abundance, the swifts in screaming mobs tearing around the rooftops but the swallows quieter and lower in the air. Similarly, this is the time when bees and particularly wasps are very active. Most bees we see around Cropwell Butler such as bumblebees are solitary and don't usually sting but wasps certainly do with many of us disliking them, but they are very useful to ecosystems as they control pests and are prodigious pollinators.

Don't miss the appearance of dragon flies particularly near ponds and ditches. You might see large hawkers or even demoiselles with their particular flying style – lovely to watch.

Watch out for bats around sunset as they usually appear to hunt insects for eating. The most common will be Pipistrelle. It's lovely at this time to see them flying around you and able to avoid crashing into the trees or bushes (or you even).

You may be privileged to have a visiting hedgehog because they will be out looking for earthworms and keeping an eye out for suitable mates. They struggle because they are reliant on soil-based invertebrates which are rare during long hot and dry spells so if you can leave out fresh water that will be a big help. **Anon**



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SHELDON FIELD NEWS

For anyone new to the village, the Sheldon Field is our local sports and recreation area. Situated behind the Village Hall, it covers around 10 acres and is managed by a dedicated group of volunteers for the benefit of the whole community. As well as being home to the cricket and football teams, it is also a lovely place for a walk, with several public footpaths crossing the site.

Latest News

Cricket matches take place throughout the summer, usually on Sunday afternoons. Look for notices at the front of the Village Hall garden, or check with Cropwell Cricket Club for details.

With the new football season approaching, new goalposts have been purchased with support from the Football Foundation. Further grant funding will also contribute to improvements to the pitches, which should benefit all who use them.

Field Maintenance

On the first Sunday of each month at 9am, all are welcome to help with maintenance on the field and sometimes elsewhere around the village. In June, volunteers cut back the willow surrounding the wildlife pond in the top left corner of the field, and trimmed the long grass nearby — making it easier for visitors to appreciate the variety of plants and wildlife in and around it.

Low-hanging branches were also removed from a tree in the top right corner, so the bench beneath it once again enjoys a fine view across the field. Long grass around the other benches was tidied where necessary to keep them as accessible as possible.

The next session is on Sunday 5 July. If you can spare a couple of hours, please do come along.

CROPWELL BUTLER PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S UPDATE July 2026

Our monthly meeting on Monday 8th June was an extended affair to hear residents' questions mainly on the maintenance works around the village, particularly the state of the cemetery, and the policy governing the allotments where nuisance fires and poorly kept plots were discussed. Allotment policy has been updated and inspections will be undertaken, aimed at addressing these concerns. The Maintenance Contract covering the next 3 years has been awarded and will begin in July. Ad hoc works were undertaken to clear nettles and remove grass bags in the playground, and to prepare the Village Hall garden for planting, thank-you to those kind volunteers.

A fantastic (or maybe coincidental) response to the village petition about the roads has been received. Works will be undertaken on the following schedule, so please be patient as the daily road closures and diversions interrupt our travel.

Hardigate Road (Village): 25 – 29 June

Hardigate Road (exiting towards hairpin): 30 June – 6 July

Main Street: 7 – 13 July; Tithby Road: 14 – 16 July ; Radcliffe Road: 17 – 28 July

In addition, works to repair the inner bank at the Rookery Farm corner of Tithby Road and Cropwell Bishop Road will be undertaken from 9 to 24 July with multi-way traffic signals. Which reminds me, at our last council meeting we also asked Neil Clarke to explore whether a speed restriction could be imposed on the road out to Tithby which passes the nursery school and in places has no pedestrian footpath. If the current road condition is improved a speed restriction on this stretch would be appropriate. I will remind Neil.

On flood works the Natural Flood Management team is now active via Trent Rivers Trust, building retention ponds and leaky barriers up the watercourse upstream of Back Lane. They will also undertake further work on NCC land the other side of the A46. It will be interesting to see how these works alleviate the flash flooding we have experienced in recent years.

Finally congratulations to the organisers of the village Summer Party held at the Village Hall on Saturday 20 June. Over 80 exuberant attendees enjoyed a fun night of camaraderie, excellent food, and music from a four-piece band. Sheldon Field lent their marquee which is available for hire, these pictures don't do it justice. There have been calls for this to be an annual event, in any case it was brilliant to see so many residents meeting up and reminding themselves what a lovely village we live in. **David Wells Chair, Cropwell Butler Parish Council**

Social Prescribing Rushcliffe is an NHS-backed service in Nottinghamshire that connects people to local, non-medical support, activities, and services to improve

their health and wellbeing. It addresses social, economic, and environmental factors-such as loneliness, debt, or housing-that impact physical and mental health.

How It Works

Instead of just relying on medication, a Social Prescribing Link Worker helps you find personalized community solutions.

- **Listening:** You get dedicated time to talk about what matters to you and what a good life looks like.
- **Connecting:** Workers link you to local community groups, clubs, and voluntary services.
- **Support:** They can guide you toward financial advice, debt counselling, or housing help.

Who It Helps

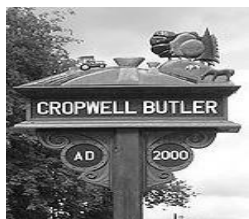
The service is available to anyone over 18 who is registered with a GP in the Rushcliffe area. It is especially helpful for people who are Feeling lonely or socially isolated; Struggling with mental health (like anxiety or low mood); Managing long-term physical health conditions; Dealing with complex social needs affecting their overall wellbeing.

Examples of Social Prescriptions

Link workers connect patients to a wide range of activities and support services; Nature-based activities: Such as conservation groups or community gardening (e.g., local allotment projects); Social and creative groups: Local walking clubs, "knit and natter" gatherings, and art classes; Physical activity: Local sports, "exercise on referral," or community wellbeing sessions; critical help: Local charities, debt counselling, and benefits advice.

How to Access the Service

- **Referral:** The service requires a referral from your GP, a nurse, or another member of your doctor's surgery team.
- **Community Drop-in:** If you are already registered with a Rushcliffe GP, you can visit their drop-in hub at the Young People's Centre in West Bridgford on Monday mornings.
- **Learn More:** You can explore local services and activities using the Rushcliffe Health Services directory. Let us know if you are looking for support for (yourself, a relative, or someone else); If there is a specific challenge they are facing (e.g., isolation, finances, or a health condition).

8th June Minutes (Extract)

PUBLIC

It was claimed that the Cemetery was in poor state – the grass is very long and needs to be cut at the cemetery. It was also raised about the issue of fires on the allotments – there are going to be tighter policies. Need a new green bin for the cemetery.

It was reported that there are going to be 50 buses per day – it is likely that the village is en-route to other locations, it will slow the traffic. More information to be provided through the newsletter.

Flight path changes have started to be implemented which means fewer aircraft are passing over the village on their way to East Midlands Airport – full implementation by June 2027.

POLICY AND PROCESS

26/27/043 Review and agree cemetery fees and policy.

It was RESOLVED to leave the wording as it is, but to change the cost grid with the following:

- Purchase of a Grave (EROB) rises from £195 to £300 (non-refundable, residents only).
- Internment in a Purchased Grave Plot, resident rises from £195 to £300, non-resident remains at £975.
- (new section) Interment of Ashes in a purchased Grave Plot, where the fee for a resident would be £300 (same as for a coffin, the admin is the same), and a non-resident (who has previously purchased / EROB) is £500.
- Interment of ashes in the Remembrance Garden (amended heading): for a resident moves from £65 to £100 and for a non-resident is £250 (to be clarified at the next meeting).
- The above is to be written up, circulated, and to go to the next meeting for approval.
- Further clarification may be required to define 'poor state' of an allotment.

- The renewal letter for next year will invoke a new deposit system of £50 (to cover water, lost keys, and remediation of allotments), and an increased annual fee of £40.
- Plots 5 and 6 in a poor state. - Plot 7 is to be offered out to a recent enquiry.
- Plot 11 is unpaid and appears not to be used, so under the rules the Council will be reclaiming this allotment and making it available for rental.

GENERAL

26/27/045 Village Hall Garden and Areas.

Agree grind-out of tree roots in village hall garden, purchase of topsoil to infill, and other make-good actions following removal of tree, with purchased topsoil to the value of £250.

- It was further agreed that a fund-raise is to be activated for anonymous donations to allow purchase of plants for the village hall garden.

26/27/047 Review Annual Safety Report for the play equipment.

- It was RESOLVED to clean the equipment with a high-pressure hose and to request care is taken not to cause any further damage through strimming.

REPORTS (information only)

26/27/051 Update report on flooding, including the natural flood management plan.

- Natural Flood Management (NFM): works other side of A46 have been completed. Some extra work is to be started for more leaky barriers, bund, and larger pond.
- Back Lane: Additional attenuation pond and some leaky barriers down the dyke adjacent to Radcliffe Road.
- Rear of the Grange: Some land may now be available for some water storage.
- Generally: There was further observation that the Parish Council is not being involved in the flood alleviation design work but that there are areas outside the scope of the NFM. There might be an opportunity to walk/talk the design/plans/options – this is to be investigated further.
- Severn Trent Water: There has been a chase for the visit to the Parish Council, with the current assumption being that they will be attending the July meeting.

26/27/052 Update report on road and traffic issues.

-Rookery Corner: Work will start on 9th July for 3 weeks to address the inside of Rookery corner.

-Radcliffe Road / Main Street: Still no progress.

- Back Lane / Cadent: There has been a couple of temporary closures of Back Lane by contractors. The contractors are trying to arrange traffic controls for longer works closures.

26/27/053 Clerk's report.

- Request received to rent allotment plot 7.

- Apologies have been received from a tenant of an allotment plot about the state of the plot, which is being addressed.

- There has been a report of hens coming through from the field and eating germinating seedlings on the allotments.

- Need to check if plot 11 has been relinquished - no payment received. Also need to chase payment for plot 1.

NEXT MEETING

13th July 2026 commencing 7.00pm.

- A 155-name petition was handed to County Cllr Neil Clarke.

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Bus News

There has been a significant change to the buses running through our village since 21st June. we have retained the hourly NCC route 747 from Cropwell Bishop to Oxtun, via Butler, Upper Saxondale, Radcliffe, Lowdham and Calverton. Also hourly the 833 run by Centre Bus continues its circular route in both directions in and out of Bingham via Langer, Granby and Aslockton.

The major change is the NCT No 11 out of Bishop has been replaced by a re-routed No12 which now goes into Nottingham through West Bridgford Central Avenue. It remains hourly, but now also provides two early morning timings from Upper Saxondale through Butler, with reverse journeys in the late afternoon and evening.

Everything is on the Nottingham City Transport website (<https://www.nctx.co.uk/>) and the weekday timetable is shown on Page 19. There is a Sunday service too - Bingham to Nottingham via Butler.
