Hiring Cropwell Butler Village Hall

The Hall is available for hire throughout the year. Hiring can be of the entire premises or for one or other of the Main Hall and Committee Room. Use of the kitchen does not generally incur an extra charge. The car park behind the Hall is also included in any hiring agreement. Hirers should note that the Garden area in front of the Hall is a public area and cannot be hired.

Alcohol

The Hall has a licence for public entertainment but not for selling or supplying alcohol. Hirers wishing to sell or supply alcohol will need to give a Temporary Event Notice to the Licensing Authority.

We have a number of regular bookings, so the Hall is not always available. It is never available on Saturdays until 4pm during term time.

Any events not specifically listed will be charged an equivalent fee, fixed at the discretion of the Booking Secretary. Rates in brackets are for occasional users unconnected with village.

All rates are per event and inclusive of setting up and clearing away.

JUNE - JOYFUL JUNE

June is quite literally ‘bustin’ out all over” – for those of you seasoned enough to remember the musical! And after a cooler unsettled start, we can look forward to warm and drier days with temperatures between 15 and 20 degrees. Wherever you roam you will notice the lush growth of trees and the vibrant greens of meadows and hedgerows.

There is much activity in the insect world. Look out for our beautiful butterflies such as red admiral, small tortoiseshell, painted lady and comma whose caterpillars will be feasting on the leaves of the abundant stinging nettles. You will notice cuckoo spit on some of the greenery, this is foam created by the young nymphs of the spittlebug to hide themselves away from harm.

There are lots of fledgling birds to be seen especially robins, goldfinches and blue tits. Swifts, swallows and martins will be catching insects on the wing. Many waterbirds have young too including swans, ducks and coots. There will also be a wealth of warblers, as well as birds of prey. You may see the sparrow hawk which seems to prefer Back Lane for its hunting ground.

This is the time for roe deer to give birth, dropping their fawns this month. Fallow deer tend to deliver in July. The natural behaviour of these animals is to leave their young lying up in vegetation (such as the nettles) while they move off to feed only a little way away, returning several times over the course of the day to suckle them. They shouldn’t be touched as the parent will abandon them if they smell human scent. Young foxes and badgers are becoming increasingly bold in their explorations above ground and early risers may see them at dawn whilst others will spot them at dusk relaxing. Watch how they grow over the Summer! Young moles will be out and about too as they search for a vacant territory. They will often unwittingly stray into the tunnels of other moles and discover the highly territorial nature of their fellow moles, who will challenge any trespassers. As they

wander in the open they are at high risk of being run over or caught and killed by predators such as foxes, only to be discarded due the foul-smelling fluid from their stomach glands. June is a time when hedgehogs are very active and will appreciate any food and water (not milk) you are able to leave out for them in your garden – particularly during hot, dry spells. June and July are the main months for their hoglets to be born and an average litter of four or five is usual. Bats are most active and likely to be seen hunting on warm, calm and dry evenings often near trees or around buildings. Female bats begin forming maternity colonies this month to give birth and raise their young, typically giving birth to a single pup which they nurse for roughly six weeks. In June, the metamorphosis of tadpoles into frogs continues as millions of babies emerge from ponds at night for the first time. This is a perilous time for them when they are extremely vulnerable to predators. The rich tapestry of the natural world is at its peak this month. Make sure you take the time to appreciate its magic.

CROPWELL BUTLER PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S UPDATE June 2026

Our monthly meeting on Monday 11th May was an annual meeting where heaps of procedures and processes were renewed, as required. One councillor was absent, but we did resolve to invite Janet Cook, who recently moved into the village, to fill the long-standing vacancy on the council so we now have a full house.

With Rookery Corner open again, we observed new closures and single-lane impositions with traffic light controls associated with Cadent gas works (they are replacing old metal pipes with plastic ones) and (soon) test drilling along Tythby Road which (good news) might be a harbinger of comprehensive resurfacing there. So more short-term pain, but hopefully improvements on several fronts.

Works continue to prepare the Village Hall garden for planting. Rubble has been removed, tree roots ground out, paving stones which would have been under the felled fir tree have been dug up and will be taken away, and topsoil is soon to be delivered. A big thank-you to the two volunteers responsible for the work - you know who you are.

The council agreed to review the Allotments policy, aiming to tighten regulations regarding on-site storage, and to undertake inspections and instruct removal of any unsafe structures and adherence to rules that require plots to be properly maintained. The £30 per annum cost per plot barely covers the water charges, so some revision to pricing is also expected. That said, a plot had just become available so there is an opportunity to take advantage of this year's pricing, please apply to our Parish Clerk, preference given to Cropwell Butler residents.

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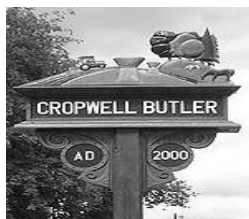

11th May Minutes (Extract)

Minutes Available on all Parish Council Notice Boards

26/27/003

- Janet Cook was proposed to be co-opted into the vacancy and it was RESOLVED to accept her into the position. Due to previous commitment she will not be able to attend until September 2026.

26/27/004

A member of the public raised an issue regarding a Cadent communication describing the replacement of metal pipes with plastic pipes, involving road closures around the village for over eight weeks, including Back Lane. Cadent have been informed of the differing flow of traffic through the affected area. It was pointed out that the Parish Council do not have power over the works but are watching with interest. It was further pointed out that Severn Trent Water are also doing some work imminently.

PLANNING

26/27/020

26/00601/FUL - Wolds Pastures, Hoe Lane, Cropwell Butler, NG12 3AE - Proposed new infill (self-build) two-storey dwelling, associated engineering operations to alter land levels, landscaping and external works. [Deadline: 20/05/2026]

The Council does not have any objection, as there is limited alteration to the amenity space but would ask that the planners look at any increase in rain-water run-off and that it will not impact on any drainage taking water off-site including the incremental effect on other dwellings.

26/27/021

26/00652/FUL - The Limes, The Fosse, Cropwell Butler, NG12 3AQ - Change of use of residential annex/short term rental property to general rental purposes.

[Deadline: 14/05/2026] The Council does not have any objection and is guided by the planners.

26/27/022

26/00724/FUL - Willow Brook, Back Lane, Cropwell Butler, NG12 3AD - Raising of existing bungalow roof by 1m to form bedrooms upstairs new single storey rear extension , new detached carport, new garden room and application of insulation and render to some elevations of bungalow. [Deadline: 16/05/2026]

The Parish Council does not have any objection with the visual design which is acceptable from the front view, but the garden room and the carport are to be constructed over a key culvert which drains the valley above Hoe Lane and historically the culvert has been unable to cope with the volume of water at times; furthermore the footings of the works may impact the culvert and cause more overflow of the culvert. The Parish Council hope that the planners will take account of any changes impacting on drainage through the culvert and the upstream open ditch. Also, the Parish Council would ask that the planners look at any increase in rain-water run-off caused by the development and that it will not impact on any drainage taking water off-site including the incremental effect on other dwellings. The planners should insist that vehicle movements during the changes are planned sympathetically with the neighbours and that any damage is retrospectively repaired. For the avoidance of doubt, the Parish Council would ask for a specific restriction not to affect or impact the flow of water through the watercourse and culvert within the curtilage of the property.

26/27/023

26/00753/FUL - Barnsfield Farm, Radcliffe Road, Cropwell Butler, NG12 3AG - Single rear extension and two storey rear extension including balcony, New rear roof light. [Deadline: 22/05/2026] The Council does not have any objection and is guided by the planners.

26/27/029

Review and approve grounds maintenance contract for the seasons of 2026-2028 inclusive. The clerk presented the quotes received from the tender and it was RESOLVED to defer the award of the contract to allow Cllr David Wells to follow up on references for Quote 2. If there are issues then the interim situation will be extended a further month. Quote 1 may be asked to 'sharpen the pencil'.

26/27/030

Agree interim grass cutting across the village by existing cemetery grounds maintenance contractor at £140 per cut. PC to agree the interim coverage of essential grounds maintenance through to the commencement of the new contract at £140 per cut.

REPORTS (information only)

26/27/031

Update report on flooding, including the natural flood management plan.

Natural Flood Management (NFM) - The project is now entering the Phase 2 delivery stage with some early works planned in May/early June on the ditch which flows towards Back Lane. The early works are the installation of leaky barriers within a section of the watercourse to store water and slow flows. The project has also secured permissions for pond creation on a field to the west of the A46 within the upper reaches of the catchment as well as more leaky barriers on the watercourse upstream of the Hardigate Road culvert. Although verbal agreements in principle have been given for more Phase 2 works, Trent Rivers Trust continue to liaise with landowners to secure the remainder of the formal permissions for the Phase 2 works which include further leaky barriers, bund construction, tree planting and storage creation adjacent to the watercourse. Construction of the remaining NFM interventions is planned for late summer/early autumn of this year.

Rookery Corner – The main works are now complete. The design for the bank reinstatement has been done and I think it is OK. It consists of concrete slabs against the bank with a kerb in front of it. Following my intervention regarding protection against agricultural vehicles, the engineers are proposing using the larger and higher kerb stones that are used for raised bus stops. Hopefully, that will act as a greater deterrent. I have been in engagement with the residents on the corner and I am calling in on 12th May to show them the drawing.

26/27/032

Update report on road and traffic issues.

Radcliffe Road/Main Street junction at The Green – The officers report that they still haven't finalised the schedule for road repairs yet, and this junction works will be scheduled after the repair schedule is completed, so no firm news as yet.

Main Street – Severn Trent Water Authority (STWA). I have been in contact with Bradley Duncan. He said he might be able to attend the June meeting but was not certain, but that he could definitely attend the July meeting. So, I have gone back and suggested it would be better to have a definite date than a 50/50. I am just waiting for confirmation he is still OK for July as he responded with 17th July and not 13th, so I hope that was just a typo. I'll confirm.

Tythby Road – closed for 3 days in a couple of weeks for drilling to check what is under the road surface. I sincerely hope this will be a prelude to finally getting it resurfaced.

White Lining – it was praised that the white lining had been completed today.

Potholes – with the apathy on raising a petition it was thought some door-knocking may improve the support of signatures to secure some priority investment on road repair in and around the village. A letter to go prior to the door-knock may assist.

26/27/033 Clerk's report.

- Grave top-up/levelling has been carried out on three graves.
- Allotment reminders have gone out and payments are being received. As a result, allotment 7 is now available. See map at the end of this report.

26/27/034

Update on Village Hall matters. - Finances appear good. The Village Hall Gardeners have voiced the desire to install an arbour in the corner of the front garden – this may spawn a discussion. - Some of the unwanted clay needs to be removed and replaced with new topsoil and compost mix – then some element of planting to be decided.

Cropwell Community Garden

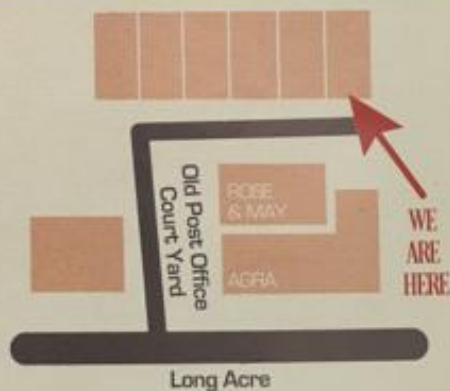
